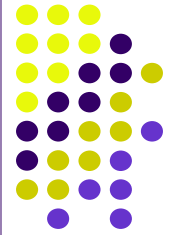

We are opening the conference ton Wednesday 3rd October to day delegates. We intend that this will encourage a broader group to attend part of the conference which will benefit the process of reflection and exchange. We ask you to encourage those you work with; portfolio holders, chairman of the Board/ Council, ecumenical colleagues who could commute for the day element 10.30-6pm to consider doing so. Matters of a particular in-house interest may be placed outside the programme of the “day” conference.

The conference centre is in the centre of Derby, a lively and eclectic city set in the East Midlands. Derby has an ongoing history of industry: engineering, pottery, tourism , rag trade and food. The town centre is currently undergoing significant development and has plenty of shops and restaurants and is within reach of the popular Peak District. See www.visitderby.co.uk

The Catalis Centre, now the Derby Conference Centre (www.catalis.com conferencing menu) has recently been refurbished to improve accessibility and restore the art deco appearance and is well equipped and compact to our needs. There is easy access to the conference centre from Derby rail station via a complimentary minibus or local taxis or buses. Road routes are good via M1/A52 or A50 or A38: and plenty of parking is available on site.

Additional equipment for small meeting rooms needs to be booked and fully accessible bedrooms will be to be allocated on first come first served basis. Please therefore indicate any access needs on your booking form. There are a limited number of ground floor bedrooms: some of which are fully accessible and no lift to 1st/2nd floor rooms. All rooms are single occupancy with en suite shower.
